### Helena Cooper's life as a blogger

When she was young, Helena Cooper was very ill. She is better now and wants to spend her free time doing interesting things. She gives information only about the places she visits, so people know it is right. Helena thinks this is why people follow her blog and like it.

Helena writes about the places she visits, but she doesn't want everyone to do the same things as her. She also thinks people shouldn't wait to do the things they really want to do. Her blog tries to show people that they *can* do those things *now!*

However, some cities have found great ways to use the places they built for the Olympics.



Two months ago, I went to the supermarket and bought lots of food, including some tomatoes and some strawberries. I got two boxes of strawberries for the price of one, and I bought a large box of tomatoes because they were reduced. When I got home, I opened my fridge and I found I already had some strawberries and some tomatoes. After a few days, I still had one packet of strawberries and some tomatoes but I couldn't use them because they were black and soft.

When I saw this, I was angry with myself. This is not clever!' I thought, and decided I must stop wasting money on things I will never use. I read some blogs to get some ideas on how to do this and changed how I shop for food.

I've learned that the best way to stop wasting food is to shop more often. That sounds strange, but it's better because I don't buy a lot each time. This means the fridge is never full, so it's easy to remember exactly what I've got. Also, I don't buy food to eat several days in the future, when I may not want to eat it for various reasons. Another thing I do is to make sure I eat all the oldest things first.

When I'm planning a meal, instead of looking in a recipe book and then looking in the fridge, I start by looking in the fridge, see what's there, and then I decide what to make with it.

I feel much happier about the way I spend money these days. I spend less, and I put less in the bin. It's better for me and better for the world!

# CHOOSING THE COLOURS OF OUR CLOTHES

- When you go to your wardrobe and choose some black jeans and a green T-shirt to wear, do you know why? Why didn't you want to wear the red T-shirt and white jeans?
- One answer to these questions is that we choose certain types of colour at different times of year. In countries with a hot summer and a cold winter, the colours we wear in spring and summer are usually lighter and brighter than autumn and winter clothes.
- One other reason we choose the colours we wear is our mood that day. If we're in a bad mood, we don't usually put on bright pink, white or yellow clothes for example. But we might wear these colours if we're in a really good mood. If our mood changes during the day, clothes we choose in the morning stop feeling comfortable, and we may want to change them.
- There may also be a colour that you never wear because you hate it. This may be because you've had a bad experience while you were wearing that colour or it may be because you think that the colour will tell people something negative about you. For example, some men don't wear pink because they think it's a colour that only women should wear.
- Another reason for hating a colour is that it does not match the type of person that you are. For example, if you're a quiet, shy person, you probably don't like wearing orange, but you might wear it a lot if you are a confident, sociable person.
- So next time you go to your wardrobe, think about why you are choosing those colours.
